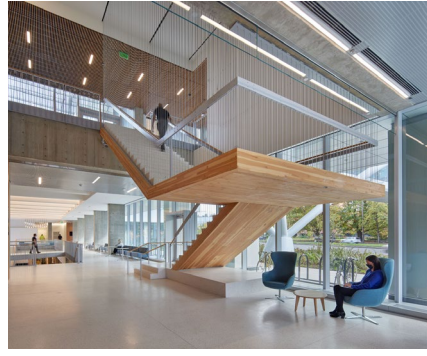


# BORA



## Net Zero Emerging Leaders Intern

Bora Architecture & Interiors is seeking an energetic, self-motivated student to join our team as a Student Intern in the field of Architecture. The ideal candidate will bring fresh ideas and a diverse perspective to the Bora team, with an ambition to learn and grow, and an interest in contributing to our creative and equitable firm culture. We are committed to broadening your experience by exposing you to a variety of project types and phases of the design process, while building relationships with staff members and supporting your professional development.

As part of the Net Zero Emerging Leaders program at Bora, you will:

- Interact regularly with a peer mentor for support and guidance.
- Connect with other team members in a series of Bora Chats that span the diverse roles within the office.
- Engage in a variety of projects tasks, from marketing to construction administration:
  - Participate in project design and sustainability discussions
  - Receive training in carbon accounting, tracking and reporting
  - Quantify carbon intensity to support teams and project performance
  - Meet 2-3 times with other ETO Net Zero Emerging Leaders
  - Deliver a joint presentation along with other Net Zero Emerging Leaders Internship Grant recipient interns at an event hosted by Energy Trust New Buildings
  - Learn to use both digital and physical tools (i.e. Revit, Miro, Adobe Creative Suite, Bluebeam, Laser Cutter and Shop training)

### Duration

- 12-week internship (January-April 2024)
- 10-15 hours per week at the Bora office (120 hours minimum)

### Requirements

- Must be currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program

in the fields of architecture, interior design, graphic design, or a related field, seeking a student internship opportunity, either for school credit or not, prior to or within one year of graduation.

- Must have a minimum of two years of higher education in architecture, interior design, graphic design, or a related field.
- Must have the ability to collaborate in a team; communicate ideas visually, verbally and in writing; and be self-motivated and willing to ask questions.
- Must be available to work in person at the Bora office located in Portland, OR, for the duration of the internship.

### Application Materials

- Statement of why you are interested in Bora/this internship
- Share Previous Experience (other internships, PT/FT jobs)
- Resume, including work/volunteer experience, education, hobbies
- Work Samples including sketches, diagrams, process work, and final material of school projects

- Opportunity to build meaningful relationships with professionals in the industry
- You will be paid a living wage based on the average median income for the Portland/Metro area at the time of your internship.
